

FIRST AID - FACT SHEET TAS



Below is a summary of PCBU's obligations regarding the management of First Aid emergencies in the workplace. The *First Aid in the Workplace Code of Practice 2020* provides practical advice about the selection, provision, maintenance and use of First Aid equipment, facilities, and services at a workplace. Compliance with the Code will ensure that you comply with your obligations under the *Work Health and Safety Act 2012* & *Work Health and Safety Regulation 2012*.

FIRST AID TRAINED PERSONNEL & EQUIPMENT

The Work Health and Safety Regulation 2012 s42 (1) & (2) states in part -

Duty to Provide First Aid

A person conducting a business or undertaking at a workplace must ensure:

- provision of first aid equipment;
- each worker at the workplace has access to the equipment;
- access to facilities for administering first aid, and
- an adequate number of workers are trained to administer first aid, or workers have access to an adequate number of other people who have been trained to administer first aid.

The Work Health and Safety Regulation 2012 s42 (3) states -

The person conducting the business or undertaking must have regard to all relevant matters including:

- the nature of the work being carried out at the workplace;
- the nature of the hazards at the workplace;
- the size and location of the workplace; and
- the number and composition of the workers and other persons at the workplace.

A documented Risk Assessment should be undertaken to ensure that the requirements and obligations of the legislation are met.
