The <u>First Aid in the Workplace Compliance Code 2008 (VIC)</u> provides practical advice about the selection, provision, maintenance and use of First Aid equipment, facilities and services at a workplace (including construction work and rural industry work).

<u>The First Aid Code of Practice VIC s91 states</u> "Having regard to the outcomes of the risk assessment, the employer needs to ensure that an appropriate number of suitably trained first aid officers are provided for the welfare of employees in the workplace."
